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From the Principal's Corner... 2020-2021 Distance Learning Expectations

September 3, 2020

General Expectations

- All students will receive instruction by a licensed Lake of the Woods School Teacher virtually in a Distance Learning Model.
- Students will receive instruction each school day following their regular class schedule.
- Students are to log-in to their classes with the teacher during that class time. If you are unable to, communicate with your teacher to make alternate arrangements.
- All academic work is completed at home.
- On a daily basis, students can expect 3-5 hours of instruction, learning activities, daily interaction with teachers, grades/assessments would count toward an overall grade.
- Daily attendance is required.
- Students are to check in to their first hour class by 8:30 a.m. daily.
- Other events and opportunities will be recreated virtually as they would occur in person.
- Teachers will be available during the assigned class period for support. Additionally, teachers will respond to student emails from 8:10 a.m. – 3:45 p.m. Please be mindful that emails sent during other times may not be answered until the next school day.

Student Expectations

- During distance learning, students will be responsible for checking in with their scheduled teachers each day. Though some flexibility may be necessary, distance learning students will need to actively participate during the scheduled class time to earn a grade for each course.
- Students will be engaged through various levels of engagements that range from live class discussions and lessons, group work, projects, and daily assignments. Students will not necessarily need to be logged into the computer the entire day as some classes will have a recorded lesson followed by independent work.
- Student work is a priority during the school day.
- Requirements will be given from each teacher for each course. In addition, unless instructed or permitted, students should be completing their own work. If a student is caught plagiarizing or cheating, the first time the student will receive a zero on the assignment, the second time the student may be removed from the class for the semester.
